Judge Kevin Ringus talked about how the City of Fife would like to recognize the accomplishments of the following Fife High School teams, players and coaches:

Football: Kent Nevin

The Fife Trojans went 5 and 5 this season with wins against Olympic, Evergreen, Clover Park, White River, and Klahowya. The Trojans also had many post season honors. Brad

Finlayson was voted 1st team RB and 1st Team DB. Chad Smith 1st Team DL, Robbie Phillips 1st Team DB, Jacob Peavler 2nd team LB, Scott Palmer 2nd team OL and DL. Over all the senior class was a class that showed dedication, commitment and represented Fife High School, and the Fife community with dignity, honor and pride. I am very proud to have had the opportunity to coach these young men.

Boys Tennis: Lauren Lundquist

The Fife High School Trojan boys' tennis team dominated the league once again this year, coming in second only to the top notch team from Washington High School. Despite the loss of several senior players from last year, the team pushed through the season with only two losses. Not only did the team as a whole succeed this year, but both sophomore Ross Boitano and senior JD Cail received the honor of making the all-league tennis team.

Cross-Country: Howard Hosley

The 2010 Fife XC team had an excellent, fun season. Though no members qualified to the state meet, the athletes performances peaked at the end of the season during the sub-district and (cold and windy) district meets. The team was led by our seniors Jacob Rummel and Rachel Knight, and paced by Juniors Joel Carrillo and Nicole McEachron. The group is young; only graduating 4 seniors. The year ended too early for many, and the athletes are now running together to make sure next year is better in the results department, while continuing to have fun and enjoy each other's company.

Girls Swimming: Jo Bushnell

Fife Swim/Dive had another successful season with capturing a 5th year consecutive League Championship. The team had their first Diving State Champion and a new meet record held by team captain Delaney Peugh. Another great season!

Volleyball: Jan Kirk

The volleyball season had a very successful one. Their final record was 30-4. They won league, won sub-districts, districts and finished 7th in State. They also won the Bellevue tournament by beating Issaquah that finished 2nd in state at the 4A level. The SPSL honored Jessica Miller and Taylor Dillard as co-MVPs of the league. First team selections were Kyla Nakamura, Lara Linden and Audra Koke. Second team selections were Amber Swayze, Amanda Koke, and Alysha Hassell. Jan Kirk was selected Coach of the Year.

Girls Soccer: Jeff Stock

This year the girls' soccer team continually bounced back from injury to have a successful season. The girls finished 3rd place in the newly created SPSL 2A League,

finishing only one point behind eventual state finalists White River. They qualified for the District Tournament, but lost in their opening match. Many girls on the team received league wide recognition, with three making the 1st team, 2 making the 2nd team, and two were listed as an honorable mention.

Golf: Mike Ryan & Tom Ellington

The girls' golf team won the SPSL league with a record of 12-0. Kendall Gray, Kayla Williams, and Britney Thurber all qualified for the state tournament in the spring. Amanda Johnson qualified for the district tournament in the spring which could also allow her to go to state.

The boys finished tied for second in the SPSL. Kevin McCrossin was the MVP of the regular season. Keynan Fanslow also qualified for the state tournament. Keynan was medalist of the league tournament. Travis Cox qualified for the district tournament. He therefore has a chance to go to state in the spring.

WSDOT Bridge Work/20th Street Closure Under I-5 (Blount)

I-5 Puyallup River Bridge Replacement

Dean Moon and Jeff Peterson from WSDOT gave an overview of planned future projects and schedule for replacing Interstate 5 (I-5) Puyallup River Bridges. They reviewed plans for Portland Avenue to Port of Tacoma Road Northbound and Southbound HOV lanes. They talked about WSDOT's commitment to participating in a regional solution on flooding issues through an executive task force, contributing \$300,000 to lower Puyallup River flood study, removing existing I-5 embankment after southbound project to maximize available flood storage, Puyallup River impacts and flood conveyance across I-5.

Councilmember Godwin asked what the impact would be on Praxair.

Councilmember asked about the impact on traffic on 20th Street.

Councilmember Alveshire asked about metered traffic lanes and lane exchanges.

Councilmember Hull voiced his preference on the closure of 20th during construction.

Councilmember Hulcey voiced concerns about traffic congestion during construction.

Mayor Johnson asked about the plans on 20th if they would meet the City's current city street standards. nHe also voiced concerns over deminishing conservation areas.

Councilmember de Booy voiced concerns about rerouting truck traffic during construction.

WSDOT - SR167 Tolling Study (Blount)

WSDOT SR 167

Director Blount introduced Craig Stone and Shuming Yan from WSDOT. Craig and Shuming reviewed the feasibility of tolling on Hwy 167 to help with funding the project. They stated tolls have funded construction of many major projects over the state's history, so the Washington State legislature authorized WSDOT to study the feasibility of using tolls to help fund two major highways. They reviewed the preliminary findings from the study, how the study was conducted, tolling options and what the next steps would be.

Each Councilmember voiced their opinion and or concerns over tolling 167.

Shawn Eagin from the Port of Tacoma talked to Council about the importance of finishing the 167 project and how to come up with the funding.

3rd Quarter Financial Report (DeGroot)

Third Quarter 2010 Financial

Director DeGroot reviewed the 3rd Quarter 2010 Financial Report to Council. He stated the local economy continues to remain stable but City revenues are not showing any significant growth. Fife lodging tax collections are below the 2010 budget and below 2009 actual. He summarized the regional economic conditions and the status of revenues and expenditures for the 3rd Quarter.

Councilmember Alveshire stated he attended the School Board Meeting and at the

meeting they approved the Fife Swim Center Facility Agreement.

PUBLIC HEARING

Amending Portside LLC Agreement - Continued (Durham)

Public Hearing Portside Business Center

Director Durham stated the public hearing was opened at the council meeting of November 23, 2010; as attendance was low, Council chose to continue the public hearing. The Pierce County Library is seeking to locate a library facility in the City of Fife. One of the parcels they are considering is parcel # 0420071164, which is part of the Portside Business Center LLC development agreement. The library has requested that this parcel be removed from the agreement and desires to build to the requirements of the Community Mixed Use (CMU) zone. The Portside Business Center owners support this amendment as it would allow the building to be constructed without triggering all of the frontage work or requiring that more buildings be immediately built.

He stated that the Portside Development Agreement was entered into in April of 2008. Since that time, the work on the site has been limited to installing the preload on building sites. The first building permit application was to be submitted to the City by January 1, 2010; this has not been done. The City of Fife is currently engaged in discussions with the Portside Business Center group with the intention of amending this agreement. That information shall be presented to council at a later date. Tonight the only change we are talking about is the removal of the Library parcel from the development agreement. Alternatively, the removal of that parcel might be conditioned on the Pierce County Library completing the purchase and ultimately developing the parcel, but not allowing any other user.

Mayor Johnson then opened the Public Hearing.

With no comments from the public the hearing was closed.

Mayor Johnson thanked Steve for his contributions and reflected back from when Mayor Wetsch hired Steve as the Community Development Director.




