CALL TO ORDER & ROLL CALL

Deputy Mayor Yambe called the Fife City Council Study Session to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilmember McClellan led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATIONS

Puyallup Tribe of Indians' Attorney, John Bell

John Bell, one of the lead attorneys for the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, made a presentation to the City Council regarding what led up to the need for a Indian Land Claims Settlement Agreement and how the Agreement still has an active role in ongoing relations between the City of Fife and the Puyallup Tribe.

Councilmember Wolfrom arrived at 6:05 p.m.

Mr. Bell responded to Councilmember questions on law enforcement jurisdictions and city boundaries.

Council thanked Mr. Bell for his historical review.

Lakewood Study on Puget Sound Regional Council

Public Works Director Blount explained that Pierce County Regional Council (PCRC) has been working for several months to finalize recommendations to the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) concerning regional centers. Implications of these recommendations may result in a shift in the distribution of transportation resources to the region according to the City of Lakewood.

The City of Lakewood is evaluating:

- Options and implications of creating a new Metropolitan Planning Organization under federal laws and a "Regional Transportation Planning Organization under state laws in contrast to the multi-country Puget Sound Regional Council; and
- The distribution of regional resources under the PCRC and Vision 2040 framework

in comparison to alternative approaches.

Mr. Blount further explained the City of Lakewood is working to form alliances with jurisdictions within PCRC who are interested in amending the Interlocal agreement with Puget Sound Regional Council.


Council was not in favor of pulling out of Puget Sound Regional Council and recommended participating more and being a voice at the Puget Sound Regional Council.


City Manager Kim reviewed agenda items scheduled for upcoming Council meetings.
