

RESOLUTION NO. 1487

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIFE, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON ADOPTING A PROCESS FOR ADDING NAMES TO THE FIFE MEMORIAL FOUNTAIN

WHEREAS, The Fife Memorial Fountain has a nearly 100 year history in the Fife community, and is now the namesake of Fountain Memorial Park; and

WHEREAS, on October 10, 1989, the City Council established the following policy for adding names to the fountain: "It is henceforth, the policy of the City Council to entertain recommendations and grant enshrinement by placement of a plaque upon the fountain of those who by their lives of faithful service, exemplary actions, and good deeds, have substantially enriched the community of Fife and the welfare of its residents"; and


WHEREAS, eleven names were enshrined on the fountain at its dedication in 1989, but none have been added since then; and

WHEREAS, the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Citizens Advisory Board has developed criteria and a process for nomination, recommendation, and City Council consideration of potential fountain enshrinees on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the proposed criteria and process complies with and furthers the policy established by the Council on October 10, 1989; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council hereby approves and adopts the criteria and nomination process for enshrinement on the Fife Memorial Fountain attached hereto as Exhibit A.

EXHIBIT A

CRITERIA AND NOMINATION PROCESS FOR ENSHRINEMENT

ON THE FIFE MEMORIAL FOUNTAIN

Nominations must be presented/submitted in person at a regular meeting of the City of Fife Parks, Recreation and Community Services ("PRCS") Citizens Advisory Board, and must be on the application form provided by the PRCS Citizens Advisory Board.

Applications will be evaluated based on the original guidelines established by the City Council on October 10, 1989. The guidelines state: *It is henceforth, the policy of the City Council to entertain recommendations and grant enshrinement by placement of a plaque upon the fountain of those who by their lives of faithful service, exemplary actions and good deeds, have substantially enriched the community of Fife and the welfare of its residents.*

A person being nominated must have been deceased at least one year from date of application.

A person being nominated need not be a Fife resident as long as the criteria listed above is satisfied.

Applications will be evaluated by the PRCS Citizens Advisory Board. Those which receive a favorable recommendation will be forwarded on to the Fife City Council for final approval. Up to 5 nominations will be forwarded to the Fife City Council in the first year of the program. In subsequent years a maximum of 2 nominations will be forwarded to the Fife City Council each year.
