

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIFE, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON ACCEPTING CONSTRUCTION OF THE PORT OF TACOMA ROAD INTERCHANGE WETLANDS MITIGATION PROJECT AS COMPLETE

WHEREAS, the reconfiguration of the Port of Tacoma Road Interchange with Interstate 5 has been a priority of the City of Fife for over a decade; and

WHEREAS, much of the planned work will be done in the infield of the existing interchange, which has been determined to be a wetland under the jurisdiction of the United States Army Corps of Engineers; and


WHEREAS, the City contracted with Berger ABAM, its lead consultant for the interchange as a whole, for the design and construction of wetland mitigation, at two sites—the oxbow site located approximately 300 feet west of 70<sup>th</sup> Avenue East and 150 feet north of Radiance Boulevard East, and Brookville Park; and

WHEREAS, the City advertised for bids for the construction of the wetlands mitigation project and upon tabulation and evaluation of all bids, BPCI Earthworks was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has determined that BPCI Earthworks has completed the Project; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fife City Council hereby accepts the construction of the Port of Tacoma Road Interchange Wetlands Mitigation Project as complete.
