

Bus Shelter Installation

Project Description

The City of Fife was awarded \$75,200 from the Regional Mobility Grant. The City of Fife, in conjunction with Pierce Transit, will be installing eight (8) new attractive bus shelters to existing Pierce Transit bus stops, serving routes 500 and 501.

The City's Bus Shelter Installation Project is adding additional bus shelters along Pacific Highway East/ SR 99, 20th Street East, and 70th Avenue East, which is consistent with the regional plan.

In addition to the bus shelters, other passenger amenities including benches, connecting pads and trash cans will also be included as part of the Project. Currently at these locations, there are no passenger amenities. Riders must stand, sometimes, up to thirty minutes to wait for connecting buses to Tacoma and Federal Way. The new bus shelters will provide cover during both rainy and sunny months.

Project Justification

Presently, these eight Pierce Transit stops see some of the highest ridership in the City, yet have zero shelter support for those riders who must wait for connecting buses. This Project will provide eight, much needed shelters for riders throughout the City, including those passengers that board and disembarking on the busy Pacific Highway East/ SR 99 corridor. Not only will the shelter provide coverage from elements, the shelters will also provide seating and trash cans. These basic amenities will not only encourage ridership, but will also help keep the City streets clean.
