- 1. Takedown Panels (City of Fife to Complete)
- 2. Pick up Panels and deliver to studio (Savy Jane Studios to arrange)
- 3. Cleanup and Prep (Savy Jane Studios to complete)
 - Purchase Materials
 - Scrub dirt off of panels
 - Sand chipping primer/paint
 - Repair ships/primer
 - Apply Primer to sides of panels
- 4. Painting of panels (Savy Jane Studios to complete)
 - Re-apply paint so that colors are rich and are not faded showing under layers
 - Re apply black outline as needed
 - Re-Apply black paint to all sided of panels
- 5. Seal and Varnish (Savy Jane Studios to complete)
 - Apply 2-3 coats of high quality varnish with UV protectant
- 6. Return delivery of repaired panels (Savy Jane Studios to complete)
- 7. Re-installation of Panels City of Fife to Complete)

Suggested Maintenance:

- 8. Annual maintenance (Either City of Fife to complete or Savy Jane Studios to complete on site at an hourly rate)
 - Wash panels to remove dirt and debris
 - Re-apply high quality varnish with UV protectant to further protect murals
